In uncertain times, we need a mayor with a vision for Austin’s future and a track record of results and fiscal responsibility.

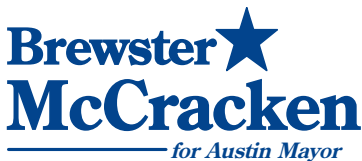
